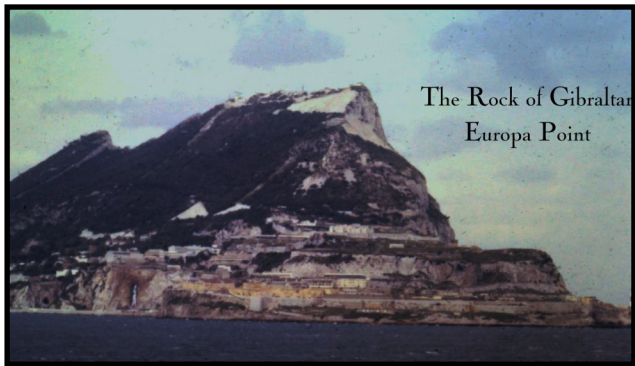


# A Three Week Transatlantic Voyage

## Circa 1978

Please join us as we welcome Captain Harold "Harry" Stumme, SUNY Maritime Graduate. His career spanned 35 years and included 111 trans-Atlantic voyages from 1962–1979. After retirement, Stumme returned to his roots on the Great South Bay. He started as a docent here at the Museum, becoming a member of the initial crew aboard the oyster sloop *Priscilla*, and is currently a member of the Museum's Board of Trustees. Harry is also a Fire Island Lighthouse Preservation Society Trustee and a member of the Marine Society of the City of New York.



During the 1970's, fast containerships made three week round-trip voyages to Northern Europe. Join Chief Mate Harry Stumme as he takes you along one such voyage; describing the ship, ports, cargo, and time at sea!

The ports of call include Portsmouth, VA; Rotterdam, The Netherlands; Bremerhaven, Germany; and Algeciras, Spain.

The ship's *refrigerated cargo* includes cheese, lettuce, beer, wine, herring, and frogs legs. The *dangerous cargo* includes safety matches, hair spray, deodorant, rum, whiskey, brandy, and x-ray film. *Radioactive cargo* includes 3 empty containers of uranium fluoride.
